Establish shared expectations well before the observation.

Observation day and time	Where and when will the observation take place?	
Observation/ classroom logistics	 How long will the observation last? Where is the best place for the observer to sit? What kinds of interaction between observer and students are okay? What does the observer need to know about the classroom and/or students? 	
Instructional goal of lesson Focus of observation	 What is the instructional goal of the lesson? What standard(s) does it align to? Why does the observee want students to achieve this goal? What is the focus of the observation? (E.g., classroom management, questioning, student discourse) What does the observee hope to gain as a result of being observed? 	
Student work and data to collect	 What will students be working on during the lesson? What work can be collected and discussed during the debrief? What data, if any, will be generated in the lesson? 	
Confidentiality	What needs to be kept confidential between the observer and observee to enable authentic growth?	
Debrief conversation day and time	Where and when will the debrief conversation take place?
